- 7. In The Patriot's Progress, what was the first crime John Bullock was charged with after missing a parade?
- 8. What name does Williamson give to Lewisham, the birthplace of Phillip Maddison, the hero of A Chronicle of Ancient Sunlight?
- 9. What actually caused the death of the legendary Bloody Bill Brock, the invincible badger?
- 10. Who was the first illustrator, with wood engravings, of Tarka the Otter?
- 11. What natural disaster is the climax of Williamson's last novel in the Chronicle series?
- 12. In a foreword to the 1936 edition of *The Flax of Dream*, whom did Williamson salute as 'a great man whose life-symbol is a happy child'?
- 13. What was the name of the sea-trout that lost its life trying to protect himself and Salar against the otters?
- 14. Which editor of The London Mercury did Williamson believe was mainly responsible for him receiving the Hawthornden Prize for Tarka the Otter?
- 15. In Tarka, what name was given to the only true otter-hound in the Cheriton pack?
- 16. What was the bird painted on Williamson's motor-cycle that was the symbol of his Nature Club?
- 17. Which First World War battle is described in the third part of A Fox Under My Cloak?
- 18. In Chronicle, what did the Vicar tell young Phillip was the reason the Socialist Oak tree was dying?
- 19. In *Tarka*, where in the White Clay Pits did the dog-otter Marland Jimmy particularly like to play hide-and-seek in his old age?
