Obituaries

John Giles Many members will regret to hear that author John Giles died peacefully on December 15th 1991, aged 70. Best known for his two classic Great War books *The Ypres Salient: Flanders Then and Now* and *The Somme Then and Now*, he inspired many thousands to visit the old battlefields in France and Belgium. A great admirer of the *Chronicle, and* for many years a member of the Society, John's life had distinct parallels with Henry Williamson; born in Lewisham, John served in the ranks before being commissioned in the Royal Fusiliers during WW2. Like Henry he was a fierce patriot, and stood for parliament before retiring due to ill health, then devoting his time to writing. Perhaps his greatest triumph came in 1980 with the founding of the Western Front Association, an organisation dedicated to remembering the men who fought in the Great War. To John, the whole ethic of remembering was a way of life, a life which in many ways he dedicated to the dead of that war. Sympathy must go to his wonderfully supportive wife, Margery, and son Howard.

Mr J. Chizlett It is with regret that we announce the death of Mr J. Chizlett in December 1990. Sadly, Mr Chizlett had only been a member for a few months.
